## MESSAGE FROM THE VICE CHANCELLOR

### **The Graduating Class of 2025, Congratulations!**

This graduation is a fulfillment of your dreams, dreams that tested your resolve to think outside the box and deliver success. We celebrate you, your triumph, perseverance, and the remarkable academic journey you have accomplished.

This year's theme: **Unlocking Potential: The Journey from Learning to Leading**, speaks to the core value of our existence. To build and nurture a dynamic workforce ready to lead socially and economically.

I thank our Guest of Honor, Rt. Hon. Thomas Tayebwa, for accepting to join us in this celebration. As the American author, Maya Angelou once put it, "People will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel." Your coming makes us feel valued, seen, and heard, and for that, we are grateful.

This year, Nkumba stood tall in global partnerships. Oil and Gas Industry leaders, TotalEnergies, partnered with Schlumberger, and the Petroleum Authority of Uganda to boost our institutions' capacity to train highly skilled professionals for

Uganda's emerging oil and gas industry with a donation of specialized computer hardware and software valued at 200,000USD.

Nkumba University has signed and renewed multiple MOUs with Universities and organizations from across the globe. Some of these include; Uganda Communications Commission, Uganda Institute of Banking and Financial Services, Holon Institute of Technology (HIT) in Israel, Dresden University in Germany, Vives University in Belgium, University of Vienna in Austria, Johannes Kepler University in Austria, Altverder University in Belgium, Protestant University of Applied Science in Germany, INTI University in Malaysia, MasterCard Foundation, Cyber Schools Technologies, Eight Tech Consultancy Limited, among others.

These MOUs are supporting multi-sectoral partnerships in the form of student and staff exchange, research undertakings, and capacity building.

In fact, through Erasmus+, AfricaUniNet, and Leonardo mobility programs, 25 staff and student mobilities were recorded. This saw our students



travel to Belgium, Austria, and Italy, while we also hosted their students here at Nkumba University. With support from the Uganda Communications Commission, we launched the Digitally Enabled Community-Centered Early Childhood Development Approach (DECEDA) Project, aimed at equipping primary school teachers from 31 schools across Uganda with the skills to effectively integrate e-learning into their teaching practices.

As always, I reaffirm my commitment to working hand in hand with our development partners to ensure that we continue propelling Nkumba University to even greater heights.

I wish to thank the Directorate of Postgraduate Studies and Research for their tireless efforts in advancing continuous research, enabling Nkumba University to contribute meaningfully to the global body of knowledge.

Between 25th and 27th June, 2025, we partnered with Mzumbe University in Tanzania and the University of Johannesburg in South Africa to host the 2nd International Conference on Governance, Leadership and Socio-Economic Transformation (ICGLST'25).

On 21st August, 2025 we hosted our Annual PhD Research Conference under the theme Ideas in Action: Translating Research into Real-World Impact.

I am pleased to report that Nkumba University continues to prioritize staff capacity building at Master's and PhD levels as a cornerstone of academic excellence. All full-time staff who enroll for a PhD have their tuition catered for 100%, while those admitted for a Master's program benefit from a 50% fees waiver.

On 18th January, Nkumba University had the honor of hosting H.E. Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, President of the Republic of Uganda, at the pass-out of more than 750 students' guild leaders from higher institutions who had completed a 14-day patriotism training on our grounds.

Same month, we hosted the global launch of Rotary WASH Institute, a Rotary International initiative seeking to address water and

sanitation-related challenges in Africa and beyond. The launch was presided over by the Immediate Past Rotary International President, Stephanie Urchick.

Our District-Based Scholarships, five per district, remain a gateway for bright minds to access education. And, through the Cyber School-Mastercard Foundation Scholarship Program, 25 students were awarded full scholarships covering tuition, accommodation, upkeep, and a laptop. In the same spirit, eight of our students with disabilities received assistive devices, including laptops, cameras, audio recorders, and glasses, under the Cyber School-Mastercard Foundation Uganda eLearning initiative.

As Nelson Mandela said, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world." These scholarships and support for our students ensure that a weapon is placed in the hands of those who need it most.

In line with our Master Plan, we continue to reimagine Nkumba University's landscape. The Sir Gordon Wavamuno ICT Complex, home to the School of Computing and Informatics, is at the completion stage.

We have embraced the 'bring-your-own-device' policy, ensuring every student steps confidently into the digital age. With support from Cyber School and the Mastercard Foundation, our eLearning capacity has expanded to over 500 per day. Encouraged by this growth, we are now venturing boldly into the deep waters of going fully digital, where students will be admitted, taught, assessed, and examined entirely online.

The Graduating Class of 2025, allow me to send you to the world of work with four principles, inspired by our theme: "Unlocking Potential: The Journey from Learning to Leading."

1. First of all, Discover and Harness Your Potential Your education has unlocked doors, but you must walk through them. As Paulo Coelho wrote in *The Alchemist*: "When you want something, all the universe conspires in helping you to achieve it." Find your passion, pursue it with courage, and

let no obstacle dim your light.

Secondly, Lead with Integrity and Service

Leadership is not a title; it is a responsibility. As John Maxwell put it, "A leader is one who knows the way, goes the way, and shows the way." Let integrity, humility, and service define you.

To build on Toffler's profound observation, I affirm that the true illiterate of the

21st century is the one unable to use a computer, go digital, and embrace a virtuous lifestyle.

4. Lastly, Build Bridges, Not Walls

Success is rarely solitary. Lift as you climb and empower others. Remember, unlocking potential is not just about your own journey, but about clearing the trail and lighting the path for others. Congratulations to you all. Go forth and unlock your potential.

Mr. Chancellor, sir,

I have the honor to present to you the PhD candidate, **Mr. ECEGA ALFRED GULI**, for the **award of Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Public Health** of Nkumba University.

Mr. Ecega's study examined the effect of humanitarian food assistance (food-in-kind, cash-based assistance, and agricultural input support) on the Nutritional Outcomes among children under five years: A case of selected refugee settlements in the West Nile sub-region of Uganda.

The study found moderate prevalence of underweight, stunting, and wasting among children from households that received dry food rations (in-kind assistance) compared to children from households that received cash assistance, who had high wasting prevalence and low prevalence of underweight and stunting. Further, the study found that refugee households that had accessed land for farming, farm tools, and farm seeds positively and significantly influenced the nutritional outcomes in terms of reduction in prevalence of underweight, wasting, and stunting among children 0-59 months in West Nile refugee settlements in Uganda.

Additionally, the level of education of caregivers of children, cultural norms/practices on food management and consumption, feeding and

food storage practices, and access to market, were found to be significant moderators on the association between humanitarian assistance and nutritional outcomes among the children 0-59 months in West Nile refugee settlements in Uganda.

Mr. Ecega Alfred Guli developed a model titled: Sustainably Integrated Humanitarian Food Assistance, Food Security and Market Systems (SIHFASAM) model for improving the humanitarian assistance programs. The SIHFASAM model emphasizes strengthening integration, market access, and resilience programming for refugees and asylum seekers for the sustainability of humanitarian assistance interventions with the ultimate aim of meeting the nutrition needs of refugee children.

I have the honour to present to you the PhD candidate, **NYENDE NOAH ROBERT**, for the award of **Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Public Health** of Nkumba University.

Mr. Nyende's study examined the relationship between health-seeking behaviours and sexual and reproductive health service utilisation among adolescents in Bugweri and Iganga districts of the Busoga region, Uganda.

The study found that adolescents' value sexual and reproductive health services for key health needs, although they face unfriendly providers, limited resources, and long travel distances. Even so, positive attitudes and strong preferences encouraged care-seeking despite cost or stigma. Meanwhile, older adolescents were more influenced by service perceptions, while those who were working engaged less unless services matched their preferences.

Mr. Nyende developed the Sustainable Preferential Utilisation of Sexual and Reproductive Health Services (SPUSRHs) model to improve adolescents' access, uptake, and equity in SRH services. It highlights long-lasting, teen-focused, and tailored care, supported by evidence-based policies and active community participation to improve service use and ensure equal availability for all.

Mr. Idiba's study examined Sanitation Practices and Child Health Outcomes: A case of Children under Five Years Old in Gulu District, Uganda.

The study found a significant negative relationship between sanitation facilities, diaper disposal, and diarrheal prevalence, suggesting that improved sanitation is associated with a reduction in diarrheal prevalence. Socio-cultural factors also have significant negative relationships with both diarrhea and malnutrition prevalence. Health system responses significantly influence diarrhea and malnutrition, indicating that timely health education and community integration can decrease malnutrition. Additionally, climate change acts as a full moderator in the relationship between sanitation practices and child health outcomes, while age and water have indirect moderating effects on these outcomes.

Mr. Idiba developed a model titled "Structural Equation Model for Diarrhoea Prevalence and Malnutrition - which Integrates Sanitation, Sociocultural, Health System, and Climate Change to Influence Child Health Outcomes in Uganda."



Key model highlights include the bidirectional relationship between diarrhoea prevalence and malnutrition, the significant reduction of diarrhoea prevalence by access to sanitation facilities, the influence of sociocultural factors on diarrhoea and malnutrition prevalence, the contribution of effective health system responses to reducing diarrhoea and malnutrition, and the impact of climate change on the relationship between sanitation practices and child health outcomes. The study emphasizes the need for integrated approaches that address multiple factors (sanitation, sociocultural, health systems, climate) to improve child health outcomes.

The study was privately funded and supervised by Prof. Norman David Nsereko and Dr. Alex Barakagira.

Mr. Ddumba's study focused on the family environment and depressive symptoms among older adults in Central Uganda: examining the moderating role of individual factor.

The study found that family cohesion was consistently associated with lower depressive symptoms among older adults in Central Uganda. Additionally, financial stability emerged as a significant moderator of depressive symptoms while cultural norms, such as stigma around expressing mental health struggles, exacerbate depressive symptoms. Tailored interventions to address such norms are crucial for effective implementation of the Family Environment Interconnection for Dialogue System (FEIDS) model.

Mr. Ddumba developed a model titled: Family Environment Interconnection for Dialogue System (FEIDS) as an auxiliary system for strengthening family structures and buffering depressive symptoms among older adults. The FEIDS suggests interconnection of members at all levels of human interaction. Community and institutions should be pivotal to initiate dialogues with the older adults where the immediate family structures have relaxed.

The study was funded through a Joint collaboration of Uganda Martyrs University, Nkumba University and RUFORUM under the Graduate Teaching Assistantship (GTA) and supervised by Prof. Nsereko David Norman and Dr. Kiyingi Frank Pio.

The study established that both formal and informal social support systems significantly influence refugees' access to socio-economic rights in Rhino Camp and IMVEPI, with refugee policy framework strongly moderating this relationship. These findings highlight the importance of coordinated policies and support networks in promoting refugee integration and rights protection.

Mr. Duuki developed a model titled: Refugee Socio-economic Rights (RESER) for improving service delivery in refugee situations. The model underscores the centrality of coordination, social support systems, and responsive policy implementation as pathways to strengthen resilience, promote equity, and foster inclusive access to socio-economic rights for refugees, thereby advancing dignity, protection, and sustainable solutions in displacement contexts.

The study was privately funded and supervised by Dr. Charles Edaku and Dr. Simon Peter Ongodia.

Human Rights Instruments were found to be a full mediator of the association between the culture of masculinity support and well-being of women. Ms. Kankindi developed the Masculinity Integrated Support Enhancing Women Well-being (MISEWW) model to improve the wellbeing of women. The MISEWW emphasizes that by encouraging healthy, constructive expressions of masculinity, men can play a supportive role in promoting the wellbeing of women emotionally, physically, and economically. The study was privately-funded and supervised by Prof. Michael Mawa and Dr. Charles Edaku.

Mr. Eumu's study assessed the Implementation of The National Environmental Management Policy on Solid Waste Management in Uganda: A Case of Selected Cities and Town Councils in Eastern Uganda.

The study found that the policy coordination, stakeholder engagement and policy environment positively contribute to better solid waste management practices in the selected urban councils in eastern Uganda. Additionally, insufficient policy enforcement, monitoring and financing decreased the effect of implementation of the national environmental management policy on SWM practices. Urban centre officials were unable to efficiently utilize the national environmental management policy to have SWM outcomes that are responsive to the needs of people. SWM operations were mostly inspired by self-interest. Lastly, there was lack of enough funds to facilitate development and implementation of laws on SWM and the urban leaders were not fully accountable to the citizens with regard to SWM.

Mr. Eumu developed a model titled: "Effective

SWM Policy Implementation and Performance for Urban Centres in Uganda" (ESWMP&PUC MODEL) for effective implementation of national environmental management policy. The ESWMP&PUC Model) highlights the need for SWM to consider lived realities of communities, empower community involvement and to ensure SWM are effectively enforced to promote people-centric SWM Services, Ecological SWM Services, Sustainable SWM Services and improved community health and livelihood.

The study was privately funded and supervised by Prof. Orach Faustino Meza and Dr. Charles Edaku.

Mr. Murongo's study examined the Contribution of Community Participation towards Sustainability of Rural Water Supply Projects in Uganda: A case of Kasese District.

The study found that community project planning positively and significantly correlated with sustainability of rural water supply projects. In addition, community project implementation was found to have a significant positive relationship with sustainability of rural water supply projects. Additionally, a positive relationship was established between community project monitoring and evaluation and sustainability of rural water supply projects. Lastly, community project financing acted as a mediator on the relationship between community participation and sustainability of rural water supply projects.

Mr. Murongo developed a model titled: Sustainable Participation Consciousness Integrated Subject to Subject Model (SPCISS) for enhancing community participation and improved sustainability of rural water supply projects in Uganda.

The SPCISS model emphasizes that sustainability of rural water supply projects is not achieved through isolated efforts. Rather, it is a result of synergistic interaction between several critical pillars that are designed to work together to ensure the long-term success of water supply projects.

The study was privately-funded and supervised by Dr. Edaku Charles and Assoc. Prof. Solomon Muchwa Asiimwe.

The study found that corporate governance roles are the strongest predictor of employee satisfaction, indicating that strengthening governance roles like policy formulation, strategic planning and resource mobilization can significantly increase levels of employee satisfaction. Additionally, the study revealed a strong positive relationship between corporate governance roles and the work environment, indicating that better implementation of corporate governance roles is associated with a better working environment in private universities.

Ms. Muhairwe developed a model titled: The Corporate Governance Convergence (CGC) model which shows how internal and external governance actors converge to foster a conducive work environment and enhance employee satisfaction. The model also provides a practical framework for universities to implement corporate governance roles effectively, and recommends the establishment of an Annual Corporate Governance Meeting, a platform



where internal and external governance actors collaborate to strengthen corporate governance roles and create a conducive work environment in private universities.

The study was funded by RUFORUM and supervised by Prof. Wilson Muyinda Mande and Dr. Anne Abaho.

The study found that the implementation of training programmes, the management of training standards, and the enforcement of compliance provisions were positively

and significantly associated with personnel development outcomes, including knowledge retention, competence, skills acquisition, and staff engagement. Furthermore, the study established that the quality management system acted as a full mediator in the relationship between training legislation and personnel development.

Mr. Othieno developed a model titled: Sustainable Training Regulations for Integrated Aviation Skills Transfer (STRIAST) model, which emphasizes competency-based training, continued professional development, effective oversight, and regulatory alignment with international standards. The STRIAST model provides a framework for sustainable personnel development by ensuring that aviation training legislation is not only adaptive and enforceable but also capable of fostering the continuous transfer of skills necessary to enhance safety, efficiency, and competitiveness in Uganda's aviation industry.

Mr. Kamusiime critically examined the nexus between pension scheme provisions and the financial well-being of teachers approaching retirement. The study established that adequacy and expansion of pension provisions were significant positive predictors of perceived financial well-being. In contrast, security, sustainability, and commitment exhibited limited or no direct contribution.

The study was privately-funded and supervised by Professor Francis Kasekende and Professor Wilson Muyinda Mande.

Mr. Kamusiime developed the Public Pension Scheme Revamp (PPSR) Model, a strategic framework emphasizing coverage, adequacy, sustainability, efficiency, and security, while advocating policy reforms that promote equity, justice, preparedness, and timely access to pension benefits. The model provides actionable insights to strengthen Uganda's pension framework and enhance the financial well-being of retiring teachers.

The study found that the quality and choice of feed resources and farmers' characteristics positively and significantly correlated with broiler production in Mukono district.

In addition, use of improved feed resource technologies was found to positively and significantly correlate with broiler productivity. Additionally, inclusion of 3% Mexican sunflower leaves in the feed was found to optimize growth of the broilers.

The study recommends that farmers' feed choices are crucial for broiler profitability, and that farmers' characteristics should be put into consideration when designing interventions to improve broiler productivity.

To address a long-standing performance measurement gap, Mr. Kirumira developed the Enhanced Medical Imaging Operational Excellence Framework (EMI-OEF). This is a context-specific, scalable tool for performance measurement and continuous improvement in resource-constrained healthcare settings such as faith-based hospitals. The framework integrates principles from the Donabedian Model



and ISO 9001 Quality Management Standards, representing a significant and innovative contribution to healthcare management in such environments.

Mr. Malek developed a conceptual framework titled the Cooperative Retention Model for Teachers (CRMT), which emphasizes the integration of retention policy design, motivational strategies, and institutional support systems to strengthen professional commitment among educators.

The model emphasizes self-regulation, adaptability, emotional balance, constructive peer interaction, and competence development as pillars for nurturing resilience, offering sustainable solutions for enhancing emotional intelligence, promoting competence-based learning, and improving students' academic welfare in secondary schools.

graduands, you inspired them, you challenged them to think differently, to question and to dream. Your dedication went beyond the textbooks, and for that I am eternally grateful.

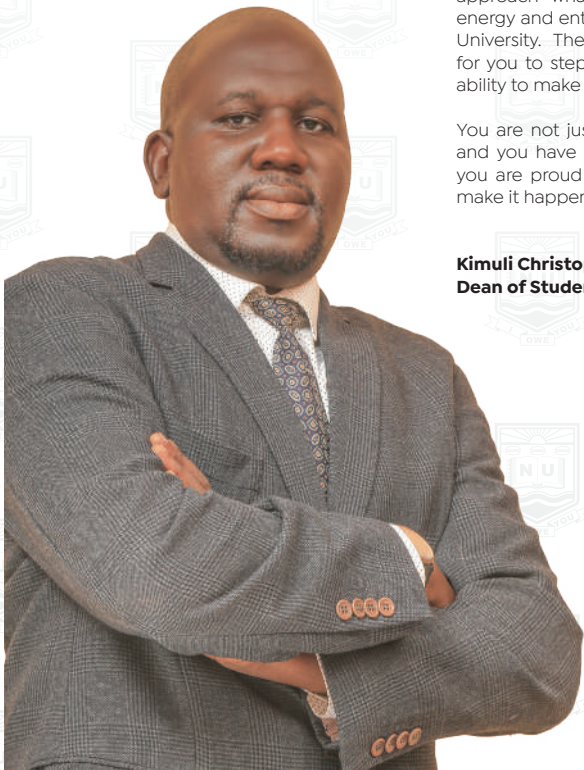
To the families, I thank you for your endless patience, your unwavering support and your guidance through their years at the University.

In modern times academic gowns and hoods have come to symbolize the weight of Academic Studies the individual wearing them has gone through and the position one holds in the institution of learning that offers the ladders of Academic Advancement and intellectual socialization.

## THE REGALIA OF NKUMBA UNIVERSITY

### The Chancellor's Robe

The colours selected are black, blue, gold and red; and the symbols taken from the Nkumba University emblem are the sun, the book, the shells (for money) and wavy lines which represent water. Black in terms of colours is the heaviest colour; it interprets very well the vital roles of the Chancellor who upholds the standards of the University. Diamonds are some of the most precious stones. In this case they symbolize the value of education Nkumba University offers.

All the hoods presented here carry black whose meaning is explained in the Gown of the Chancellor of Nkumba University.

Being a lawyer is an extraordinary calling to serve clients and the public good. **Purple** attributes pomp to lawyers and distinguished them from all other graduation categories.

The hood of the criminal Justice academic dress incorporates **Red** and **Purple** colours. **purple** symbolizes royalty, creativity, wisdom, dignity, gradeur, devotion and peace whereas **Red** signifies passion, courage and confidence criminal justice graduates and specialists should embrace while serving society. Above all criminal justice specialists serve the society in various capacities with patience, integrity, empathy, courage and discernment.

## University Emblem

It has the shape of a shield to symbolize protection. The sunto symbolize light, and the shells represent business transaction. The book is a symbol of learning. The blue water represents lake

Victoria which is within the vicinity. And the motto, "**I OWE YOU**" is a bond between the University, the Students and the Administration.

## The Mace

In a University a mace symbolizes the authority. The shape of the mace represents the gradual growth of Nkumba University from a small kindergarten to a University. The carvings on the sides show the smooth transitions at various stages of the growth. Nkumba University symbols in the mace are; the book and shells which are selected from the University emblem.

The letters NU also stand for Nkumba University. The seven hanging strings in **Red, Yellow, Blue, Orange, Purple, Green, Grey** and **White** on the mace, represent the Seven Schools of Nkumba University.

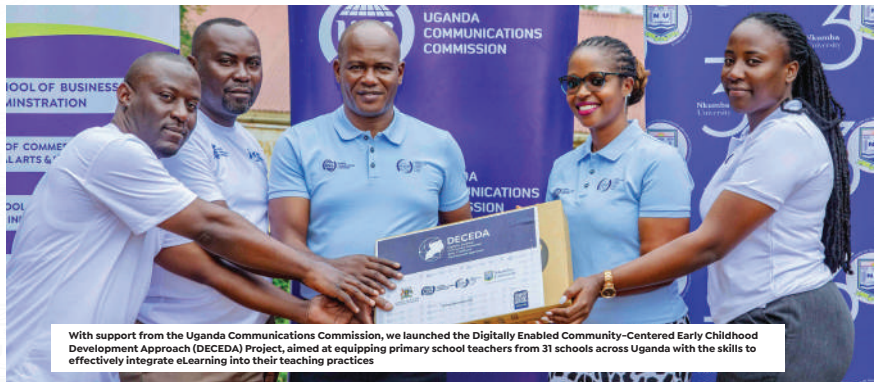

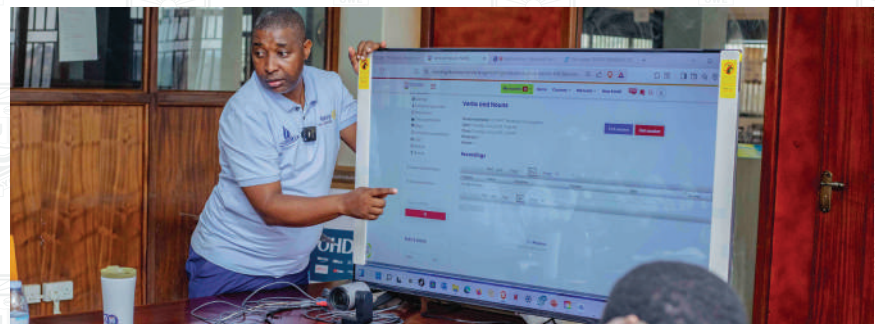

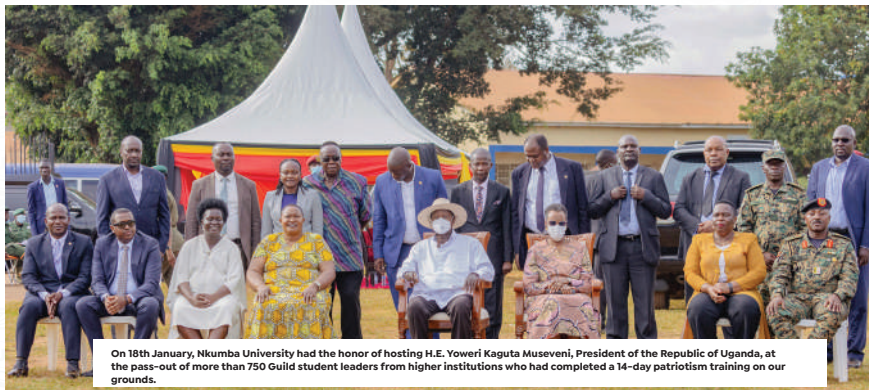
